2015 AHA Guidelines update for CPR and ECC

Compress at a depth of at least 2 inches or 5 cm for adults and children but no more than 2.4 inches or 6 cm. Compress at a rate of at least 100-120 compressions per minute. Push hard and fast. Make sure you allow the chest to completely recoil between compressions. After 30 compressions, give 2 breaths.

Spend 5-10 seconds checking the brachial pulse on the baby’s upper arm that’s nearest to you. If the victim has no pulse, begin with 30 compressions on the infant’s chest using 2 fingers. The rate should at least 100 compressions per minute. Use a bag valve or pocket mask to open the victim’s airway with 2 breaths.

CPR with an Advanced Airway An advanced airway is the use of a laryngeal mask, supraglottic or endotracheal tube. When you use an advanced airway, you do not stop compressions to give breaths like you do during 2 person CPR. Give one breath every 6-8 seconds and there should be no pause in chest compressions for delivery of breaths.
