After many decades of research, it is now generally accepted that in most cases atrial fibrillation is triggered (starts) from inside or close to the pulmonary veins. The pulmonary veins are vessels connecting the lungs to the left atrium that allow oxygen-enriched blood to return to the heart.

One option is to perform an ablation at the AV node and permanently stop the transmission of electrical impulses from the atria to the ventricles. This means the atria will continue to be in fibrillation but that the ventricles will be beating too slowly.

Atrial fibrillation ablation is a procedure used to treat an irregular heart rhythm (arrhythmia) that starts in the heart's upper chambers (atria). It's a type of cardiac ablation, which works by scarring or destroying tissue in your heart to disrupt faulty electrical signals causing the arrhythmia.

Recurrence of atrial fibrillation or symptoms is not uncommon early after the ablation, particularly in the first 3 months as the heart is healing. This does not necessarily meant treatment failure. Your usual medications to control the heart rhythm will typically be continued for a number of months to reduce the risk of this.

Catheter Ablation for Atrial Fibrillation

Catheter ablation for this very common arrhythmia with maintenance of normal sinus rhythm showed an improvement in eGFR with 5 year follow up in the nondiabetic population as compared with medical therapy. As one might expect, no recurrence of the atrial fibrillation was independently associated with the long term improvement.

Catheter Ablation for Atrial Fibrillation: Renal Function

Atrial Fibrillation (AF) is a chaotic heart rhythm. Atrial fibrillation ablation helps maintain a normal heart rhythm. Ablation uses small burns or freezes to cause some scarring on the inside of the heart that helps to break up electrical signals that cause an irregular heart rhythm. This can return your heart to normal sinus rhythm (SR).

" Persistent atrial fibrillation is a complex disease and sometimes more than one ablation is needed," says Dr. Mansour. " I ' ve found that 20%–30% of persistent afib patients need a second procedure but success rates of over 70% are possible. "

Persistent Atrial Fibrillation Often Requires Multiple

An ablation is usually performed when the arrhythmia is causing symptoms that interfere with the person ' s quality of life, such as stopping them from doing their job or normal daily activities, and when they haven ' t responded to other treatments, such as medicines.

Accumulating evidence shows that atrial fibrillation (AF) is associated with an increased risk of dementia.
